"URBAN FEAR" has been an important theme in studies exploring reasons for the rise of gated residential communities worldwide. Initially used in the North American context, where walled localities and private security systems became matters of prestige, these built upon ideas of racially segregated neighbourhoods promoted in many American cities. Over the past few decades, the term has been applied to the profusion of gated enclaves globally. In Shanghai, residents of upmarket enclaves fear the "uncivilised" behaviour of villagers; Sao Paulo's heavily guarded neighbourhoods exude paranoia against the working poor; and Johannesburg's elite utilise surveillance technology developed for military purposes to create landscapes of suspicion and segregation. Urban fear in different parts of the world is generated by privileged sections, concerning their perception of being under threat from "hostile" populations. These are seen as threats to life, property and ways of life, prompting behind walls fortified with surveillance, automated entrance technologies and security guard retreats; in some cases, armed response is at call. During the day, feared populations enter to provide services such as garbage collection, cleaning and

gardening; at night, they must leave. A new kind of urban fear haunts indian cities, not about class hierarchies but driven by manufactured rumours and arbitrary actions against the vulnerable. In Gurugram, despite official assurances, Bengali-speaking populations — part of those servicing gated communities — now fear state action.

Families book train tickets for young men to return to villages in West Bengal as they are most likely to be picked up for questioning. This version targets those who cannot retreat to gated security. The threats they face are real, characterising the everyday violence of life for the poor. When such threats become intolerable, their only choice is to return home, causing massive dislocation in family life and livelihoods. What does urban fear from a "foreigners" scare do to cities and their role as engines of growth? Since 2015, the Smart Cities Mission has invested heavily in infrastructure, but state-generated urban fear undermines such claims. Promulgation of urban fear as a state initiative damages trust in the state. For most citizens, everyday acts of governance are experienced through spectacle and performance. If fear becomes the key manner in which the state is experienced, identifying a section as "dangerous," it undermines democracy. The irony is that those being driven out — primarily linguistic and religious minorities — are the state's strongest supporters, while the secure mistrust the state and favour privatisation. Two consequences emerge. First, it diminishes lives without reason and reduces diversity essential for smart cities. Displacing its strongest supporters undermines the state's presence. Second, the better off, who do not protest, may also face arbitrary action. Once arbitrariness is allowed, it becomes the state's second nature. Walls and gates may shield from imagined enemies, but under guided fear, such protection is illusory.



Tamil Nadu and Karnataka are planning to implement a two-language formula for school education, as opposed to the push for a three-language policy in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Both States are inclined towards primacy for local languages, Tamil and Kannada, respectively, and then English in school education. Tamil Nadu has already unveiled its State Education Policy (SEP) while a commission has submitted its recommendations for Karnataka's SEP. Tamil Nadu has merely reiterated its existing two-language policy, but Karnataka is set to discontinue its three-language policy. The commission has proposed that Kannada or the child's mother tongue should be the medium of instruction up to Class 5, and preferably till Class 12. Kannada or whatever is the mother tongue and English will be the two compulsory languages. If implemented, this will replace the model that includes Hindi as a third compulsory language. Other recommendations include moving away from NCERT textbooks and developing a Karnataka-specific curriculum and bilingual teaching methods. The Tamil Nadu SEP, which was announced by Chief Minister M.K. Stalin recently, makes Tamil compulsøry up to Class 10 across all boards. The NEP proposes a third language which should be Hingh or another Indian language, seen as an attempt to impose Hindi.

The Tamil Nadu SEP also commits to promote critical thinking, digital literacy, climate education, and social justice. Apart from a STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics) approach, the State also wants to offer special support for tribal students, first-generation learners, and students with disabilities. The government has pledged more support for public education. In fact, uniform high quality public education should be the biggest priority of school education policy for all States and the Centre. The Centre's ill-advised focus on language turns unproductive and controversial even though it does not insist on promoting Hindi on paper. The three-language policy is also in disregard for the demand for English language learning, and as a medium of instruction across States, including in the Hindi-speaking regions, and Gujarat and Maharashtra. Education policies have been a major driver of the development outcomes in Tamil Nædu and Karnataka, and any attempt to forcibly alter them by central policies would do no good to anyone. Tamil Nadu is fighting for the release of ₹2,152 crore in education funds from the Centre that is rightfully its. There is no harm in learning Hindi or any other language, but when perceived as a political project of domination, its promotion causes resistance. The Centre must give up its language obduracy and focus on several critical challenges in school education. It must work with State governments to tackle them.





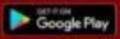
