### **ANSWER WITH EXPLANATION**

1. Answer: D

Repugnant – making you feel disgust, incompatible, inconsistent

The synonym of repugnant is repellent, obscene, obnoxious and the antonym of the word is innocuous.

Hence option D is the answer.

2. Answer: D

Tenuous – having little substance or strength, weak

The synonym of Tenuous is dubious, fragile, elegant and the antonym is plausible.

Hence option D is the answer.

3. Answer: E

Sanguine – optimistic or positive

Here all words denotes the same meaning of

Sanguine

Hence option E is the answer.

4. Answer: A

**Incite** – to encourage something, to spur on, to urge on

The synonym of Incite is provoke, instigate, ferment and the antonym is Tranquilize.

Hence option A is the answer.

#### 5. Answer: C

Enervate means (lacking) or drained of energy or vitality. In sentence C it gives just the opposite sense of enervate and hence is incorrect.

Therefore, in the given question the correct answer is option C.

#### 6. Answer: D

Adamant means refusing to be persuaded or to change one's mind.

If we look at the sentences given here we can easily understand that in sentence C the context does not quite match with the word adamant. We need a word which has a positive sense. So it is incorrectly used here.

Therefore, the correct answer is option D.





#### 7. Answer: A

Negligent means failing to take proper care over something.

In the very first question we can see that there is a clear contradiction of senses. A person cannot be punctual as well as negligent both. Hence we can understand that it is incorrectly used here. Therefore, in the given question the correct answer is option A.

#### 8. Answer: E

Approbation is a noun which actually means approval or praise.

In all the given sentences the word has been correctly used.

Therefore, the correct answer is option E.

#### 9. Answer: A

Extirpate (verb) – eradicate or destroy completely Here only sentence A is in verb form where other sentences are not in verb form Hence option A is the answer.

10. Answer: B

Fervent (adjective) – having or showing strong feelings

Here option B explains in verb form where other options belong to adjective form of fervent.

Hence option B is the answer.

#### 11. Answer: D

Fierce (adjective) – violent, anger, aggressive Here the sentence D alone gives the form of adjective where other options do not belong to adjective form.

Hence option D is the answer.

Denounce (verb) – to say publicly that something is wrong

Here all the given sentences are in noun form. Hence option E is the answer.
