Mid-cap funds could liquidate 50% and 25% of their investments within a maximum of 34 and 17 days, respectively.

Simplified KYC for Securities Markets: while dealing in securities markets, once KYC is done through a Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) registered intermediary such as a broker,

Stock Exchange Listing Requirement: An SFB intending to transition to a universal bank must be listed on a **recognized stock exchange**.

Out of the 10 SFBs, **only North East Small Finance Bank** is not listed.

Financial Performance and Asset Quality: SFBs must have reported net profit in the last two financial years.

Gross non-performing assets (GNPA) and net non-performing assets (NNPA) must be less than or equal to **3% and 1%**, respectively, over the last two financial years.

Promoter Requirements: There is no mandatory requirement for an eligible SFB to have an identified promoter.

However, existing promoters, if any, must continue as promoters upon transition.

No new mandatory lock-in requirement of minimum shareholding for existing promoters in the transitioned universal bank.

Regulatory Structure upon Transition: Upon transition, the universal bank will be subject to all norms, including the **Non-Operative Financial Holding Company (NOFHC) structure (as applicable)**.

Reason for Declining SFB Option: Annapurna Finance Limited was hesitant to pursue the SFB route, considering that a majority of SFBs are still yet to establish a dominant share in the industry.

An Electronic Trading Platform (ETP) is **any electronic system, other than a recognized stock exchange**, on which transactions in eligible instruments are contracted.

An entity seeking authorization as an ETP operator must maintain a minimum net worth of **Rs 5 crore** and continue to maintain this minimum net worth at all times.

Technology Infrastructure Requirements:

The entity will also have to maintain a robust technology infrastructure with a high degree of reliability, availability, scalability and security concerning its systems, data and network, appropriate to support its operations and network, appropriate to support its operations and manage the associated risks.

History of ETP Regulation:

In **October 2018**, the RBI implemented a regulatory framework for ETPs to execute transactions in financial instruments regulated by the central bank.

This framework aimed to ensure fair access and robust trading infrastructure.

Currently, **13 ETPs** operated by 5 operators have been authorized.

Authorizations and Eligible Instruments:

In respect of eligible instruments, the draft stated that ETP operators **authorized by/registered** with the RBI should ensure that transactions only in instruments approved by the central bank are contracted on their platform.

No entity, resident or non-resident, can operate an ETP without obtaining prior authorization of, or having registered with, the Reserve Bank.

Public Consultation on the Draft Framework:

The RBI has invited comments on the draft directions from ETP operators, banks, market participants, and other interested parties by **May 31, 2024**.

According to a Niti Aayog report unveiled in October 2021, at least 30% of the population, or 400 million individuals – called the missing middle in this report – are devoid of any financial protection for health.

Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PM-JAY) scheme was launched on 23rd September, 2018 in Ranchi, Jharkhand by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi.

About PM-JAY

Ayushman Bharat PM-JAY is the largest health assurance scheme in the world which aims at providing a health cover of Rs. 5 lakhs per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization to over 12 crores poor and vulnerable families

(approximately 55 crore beneficiaries) that form the bottom 40% of the Indian population.

The households included are based on the deprivation and occupational criteria of Socio-Economic Caste Census 2011 (SECC 2011) for rural and urban areas respectively.

M-JAY was earlier known as the National Health Protection Scheme (NHPS) before being rechristened. It subsumed the then existing Rashtriya Swasthya Bima Yojana (RSBY) which had been launched in 2008.

The coverage mentioned under PM-JAY, therefore, also includes families that were covered in RSBY but are not present in the SECC 2011 database. PM-JAY is fully funded by the Government and cost of implementation is shared between the Central and State Governments.

It covers up to 3 days of pre-hospitalization and 15 days post-hospitalization expenses such as diagnostics and medicines.

There is no restriction on the family size, age or gender. All pre-existing conditions are covered from day one.

The scheme is being implemented by the National Health Authority.

Bajrang Punia is the first Indian wrestler to be ranked world no.1 and first to win four world championship medals. He won a bronze medal at the Tokyo Olympics.

The Madhya Pradesh state cooperative dairy federation, which sells milk and products under the hugely popular 'Sanchi' brand, has collaborated with the country's biggest cooperative Amul for expanding its operations and boost procurement from the farmers.

Sanchi procures only in the 20-25% of milk producing region. The collaboration with Gujarat Co-operative Milk Marketing Federation (GCMMF) will help the state cooperative to expand operations to other parts of the state.

MP is the **third-biggest** milk producing state in the country. Sanchi purchases one million litres of milk from farmers mostly in the western region of the state such as Indore, Ujjain and Bhopal. Sanchi's overall procurement of milk is now growing at **7-8% annually**. It has six district unions – Bhopal, Indore, Ujjain, Gwalior, Jabalpur and Bundelkhand, out of which Gwalior and Jabalpur are the unions where milk procurement has stagnated.

Currently, around 60-65% of milk procurement by Amul is carried out in Gujarat and it is ranked as the eight-largest dairy organisation globally.

In connection with this decision, Zomato has incurred an impairment loss of Rs 39 crore for its investment in ZPPL, its fintech subsidiary.

The prepaid payment instrument license allowed Zomato to provide wallet and cash card services to its users, while the online payment aggregator license granted the platform greater control over payments on its platform, including those made through third-party apps.

While ZPPL has opted to surrender its online payment aggregator license, its other operations will persist.

To recall, Zomato had incorporated a wholly-owned subsidiary (ZPPL) in August 2021 to comply with RBI regulations for payment aggregator services and payment gateway services.

The firm received the RBI's nod to carry out business as payment aggregator and issuer of pre-paid payment instruments in January, 2024.

What is payment aggregator?

A payment aggregator is a **third-party service provider** that enables customers to make and businesses to accept payments online.

Payment aggregators enable their clients to accept various payment methods such as **debit cards, credit cards, cardless EMIs, UPI, bank transfers, e-wallets, and e-mandates**.
