

**Most Important Current Affairs of the Month**

**ISRO’s Successfully Lift Off Anomaly in PS3 Stage of PSLV-C62/EOS-N1 Mission**

India’s PSLV-C62 rocket carrying the EOS-N1 satellite encountered an anomaly during the final phase of its third stage on January 12, 2026. The launch took place from Sriharikota after a 22.5 hour countdown. While initial stages performed normally, deviations in roll rate and flight path were observed, prompting ISRO to begin a detailed technical analysis.

**Why in News?**

The PSLV-C62/EOS-N1 mission faced a technical anomaly near the end of the PS3 stage. ISRO confirmed that the issue led to deviations in the rocket’s trajectory, and further assessment of mission data is in progress.

**Mission Overview and Launch Details**

The PSLV-C62/EOS-N1 mission followed a 22.5-hour countdown before lifting off from Sriharikota, marking the 105th launch from the spaceport and the 64th flight of the PSLV. The mission used the PSLV-DL variant, which features two strap-on boosters, and was the fifth flight of this configuration.

EOS-N1, an Earth observation satellite built for strategic applications, was the primary payload. The launch was a commercial mission executed by NewSpace India Limited (NSIL), ISRO’s commercial arm. Alongside EOS-N1, 15 co-passenger satellites developed by startups and academic institutions from India and abroad were onboard, reflecting India’s growing role in the global small satellite launch market.

**Planned Mission Profile**

Under the original mission plan, EOS-N1 and 14 of the co-passenger satellites were to be injected into a Sun Synchronous Orbit (SSO). The remaining payload, the KID capsule developed by Orbital Paradigm (Spain) in collaboration with RIDE (France), was intended for a re-entry experiment.

Following satellite deployment, the PS4 stage was scheduled to restart to de-boost itself and enter a re-entry trajectory. Both the PS4 stage and the KID capsule were expected to re-enter Earth’s atmosphere and impact the South Pacific Ocean. ISRO has not yet confirmed whether these objectives were achieved.

**What Did ISRO Say About the Anomaly?**

ISRO Chairman V Narayanan stated that a deviation was noticed during the third stage of the rocket. He clarified that mission data is currently being analysed and that ISRO will share detailed findings soon. At present, the mission has not been officially declared a success or failure.

**Key Payloads and Strategic Importance**

One of the major satellites onboard was Anvesha, a surveillance satellite developed by the Defence Research and Development Organization. Anvesha is designed to provide advanced imaging capabilities, enhancing India’s ability to monitor and map strategic locations with high precision, which is vital for national security and disaster management.

**Role of the Private Space Sector**


The mission marked a milestone for India’s private space ecosystem. For the first time, a single private company, Dhruva Space from Hyderabad, contributed seven satellites to a PSLV mission. This highlights the growing collaboration between ISRO and private players following space sector reforms.

**WEF Global Risks Report 2026**

The **World Economic Forum (WEF) Global Risks Report 2026 (21st edition)** paints a worrying picture of the coming decade. The report suggests that the world is moving into an **“Age of Competition”**, where rivalry between countries is intensifying—not only in the military space, but also through **trade restrictions, sanctions, technology controls, and information warfare**. This shift is creating a global environment where shocks spread faster, cooperation becomes harder, and societies become more vulnerable to instability. The report ranks risks across **two key time horizons**—the near future (2 years) and the long term (10 years). Its core message is straightforward: the global landscape is becoming **more fragmented, more unpredictable, and more exposed to multiple overlapping risks**.





1) What Does WEF Mean by “Global Risk”?

WEF defines a **global risk** as a threat or event that can cause major negative impact on a large scale, affecting:

- the world’s population
- the global economy
- natural resources and ecological systems

This definition matters because it places emphasis on threats that cross borders, spread rapidly, and create ripple effects across regions.

2) How the Report Is Built

The report is primarily based on expert perceptions collected through global surveys of leaders and specialists across sectors. It then organizes risks into categories such as:

- Geopolitical
- Economic
- Societal
- Technological
- Environmental

It also studies how risks connect with each other, showing that crises rarely happen in isolation. Instead, one major event often triggers several others.

3) Global Mood: Instability Is Rising

A major finding of the report is that a large share of experts expects the world to experience **turbulence** in both the short and long term. This suggests that many see current tensions as part of deeper structural changes rather than temporary fluctuations.

**Main reasons behind the growing instability include:**

- rising rivalry between major powers
- shrinking space for international cooperation
- economic pressures such as high debt and uneven growth
- rapid technological disruptions
- intensifying climate impacts

4) Most Likely Crisis Trigger in 2026: Goeconomic Confrontation

The report identifies **goeconomic confrontation** as the most likely risk to trigger a global crisis in 2026.

**What goeconomic confrontation means**

It refers to the use of economic tools as instruments of strategic power, such as:

- sanctions and counter-sanctions
- tariffs and trade barriers
- restrictions on technology exports
- control over supply chains
- manipulation of critical resources (oil, gas, rare earth minerals, chips)

**Why it is dangerous**

Goeconomic rivalry:

- disrupts global trade networks
- increases inflationary pressures
- reduces investment confidence
- weakens global supply chains
- creates uncertainty for industries and jobs

In today’s world, economic rivalry is becoming as destabilizing as direct military confrontation.

5) Conflict and Security: The Risk of Armed Escalation

Along with economic rivalry, the report highlights **state-based armed conflict** as a leading risk. Conflicts today have grown more complex because they often combine:

- conventional warfare
- cyberattacks
- economic sanctions
- information manipulation

**Key concerns linked to armed conflict**

- damage to infrastructure and energy networks
- global commodity price instability
- increase in displacement and migration
- rising military expenditure at the cost of development spending

6) Information Crisis: Misinformation, Disinformation, and Polarization

One of the strongest warnings in the report is the growing influence of **misinformation and disinformation**, especially through digital platforms. The report links false information with **social unrest and political division**.

**How misinformation becomes a global threat**

- spreads confusion during crises (pandemics, wars, disasters)
- reduces trust in governments and media
- creates fear and anger among communities
- influences elections and public decision-making

**Societal polarization: a connected risk**

Polarization means deep social division where people move into rigid groups and stop trusting each other.

It leads to:

- frequent protests and instability
- weaker policymaking and governance
- rising hostility between communities
- breakdown of social harmony

7) Economic Risks: Signs of a Possible Reckoning

The report notes that economic risks are rising sharply in importance.

**Major economic risks highlighted**

- **economic downturn**
- **inflation resurgence**
- **asset bubble risks**
- widening gap between rich and poor

**Why these risks are increasing**

Some key drivers include:

- high public and private debt
- unstable trade flows
- pressure on currencies and interest rates
- financial market volatility

A prolonged downturn could amplify societal anger, unemployment, and political instability.





8) Cyber Insecurity: A Direct Threat to Critical Systems

In the digital era, cyber insecurity has become one of the most immediate global risks.

- hospitals and healthcare data
- government databases
- military systems

**Why cyber risk is rising**

- increasing digital dependence
- growth of ransomware attacks
- state-sponsored cyber operations
- weak cybersecurity capacity in many sectors

Cyberattacks can cause economic loss and also shake national security.

9) AI Risk: Powerful, Fast—and Hard to Control

The report emphasizes that **adverse outcomes of AI technologies** are among the most significant long-term threats.

**What AI-related risks include**

- deepfakes and automated misinformation
- job displacement in multiple industries
- algorithmic bias and discrimination
- surveillance and privacy violations
- autonomous weapons and AI-driven warfare
- concentration of AI power in few hands

AI is described as a double-edged technology—it can boost productivity, but without strong safeguards it can weaken trust, stability, and accountability.

10) Environmental Risks: The Most Dangerous Long-Term Threat

The long-term risk ranking is dominated by environmental dangers. The report highlights that climate risks are not only continuing but intensifying.

**Top environmental risks (long-term)**

- **extreme weather events**
- **biodiversity loss and ecosystem collapse**
- **critical changes to Earth systems**
- pollution
- resource shortages (water, food, minerals)

**Why this is alarming**

Environmental damage creates chain reactions:

- crop failures and food insecurity
- water stress and conflicts
- forced displacement
- economic shocks
- increased health emergencies

The report warns that climate stress can become a multiplier—making economic and political risks even worse.

11) Inequality: The Most Interconnected Global Risk

A very important insight of the report is that **inequality** is one of the most “connected” risks, meaning it triggers or strengthens several other threats.

**Inequality fuels:**

- political dissatisfaction
- crime and insecurity
- social unrest
- polarization
- migration pressures
- weakening of trust in institutions

This shows that inequality is not just a social problem—it is also a governance and stability issue.

12) The World Order Ahead: Multipolar and Fragmented

The report suggests that the world is shifting away from a single dominant power structure. Instead, it sees the future as:

- **multipolar** (many major powers)
- or **fragmented** (regions setting different rules)

**What this could lead to**

- competing trade blocs
- multiple technology ecosystems
- inconsistent global regulations
- reduced effectiveness of international institutions

This fragmentation makes collective action harder—especially on climate, global health, and conflict prevention.

**Henley Passport Index 2026**

The **Henley Passport Index 2026** once again highlights the sharp divide in global travel freedom, ranking passports based on how many destinations their holders can visit without needing a visa in advance. India's global travel access has seen a modest improvement in 2026. According to the latest passport rankings, Indian travellers can now visit more countries without lengthy visa procedures than last year. However, significant limitations remain for popular destinations like Europe and North America, shaping how Indians plan international trips.

Why in the News?

The Henley Passport Index 2026 has ranked **India at 80th position globally**. Indian passport holders get visa free, visa-on-arrival or e-visa access to 55 destinations, up from last year's rank of 85.

India's Rank in the Henley Passport Index 2026

- India is ranked 80th in the Henley Passport Index 2026. Indian passport holders currently enjoy visa-free or visa-on-arrival access to 55 destinations.
- India shares this position with Nigeria and Algeria, while regional neighbours Bangladesh and Pakistan rank even lower.
- The data reflects a significant mobility gap within South Asia and between India and leading global economies.

World's Most Powerful Passports in 2026

- At the top of the rankings, Singapore holds the number one position, with its citizens enjoying visa-free or visa-on-arrival access to 192 destinations, the highest in the world.
- Japan and South Korea jointly occupy the second position with access to 188 destinations, reflecting their strong diplomatic networks and stable international relations.
- Europe continues to dominate the upper ranks, with multiple EU countries offering access to over 185 destinations, highlighting the strength of European diplomacy and integration.





Which Country Has the Weakest Passport in the World?

- Afghanistan (Rank 101) – 24 destinations
- Afghanistan holds the weakest passport globally, allowing access to just 24 destinations without a prior visa.
- It is followed closely by Syria and Iraq, underscoring how conflict, political instability, and security concerns sharply limit international mobility.
- The gap between the most powerful passport (Singapore) and the weakest (Afghanistan) now stands at 168 destinations.

**Andhra Pradesh**

- Andhra Pradesh Cabinet approved **Dagadarthi Greenfield Airport** in Nellore district, becoming AP's **8th airport**, handling **1.4 million passengers** in Phase-I.

**Arunachal Pradesh**

- The Union Environment Ministry's expert panel has recommended **environmental clearance** for the **Kalai-II hydropower project**. The decision has sparked concern among conservationists, who argue that the project's environmental impact assessment ignored the presence of the **critically endangered white-bellied heron** in the **Lohit River basin**.

**Karnataka**

- Chief Minister **Siddaramaiah** has emerged as the **longest serving Chief Minister** of the state, a rare achievement in a politically dynamic landscape. His journey reflects **resilience, social justice politics**, and deep grassroots connect, making his leadership tenure both politically and historically significant.

- Karnataka's wildlife has drawn national and global attention with the discovery of an **extremely rare leopard color variant**. This unique big cat, nicknamed the "**Sandalwood Leopard**" has been documented for the first time in the state. The sighting highlights the **remarkable genetic diversity** of leopards in Karnataka and strengthens its reputation as one of India's most important landscapes for **big cat conservation**.
- Karnataka Cabinet approved '**Akka Pade**' (Elder Sister Force) scheme to strengthen **women and minor girls protection**, with **phased rollout across 31 districts**.
- **Akka Pade** scheme involves **patrolling sensitive areas** (7 AM-8 PM) and **public awareness campaigns** on **child marriage, trafficking**, and legal protection.
- Karnataka launched '**Gruha Lakshmi Digital Marketing**' portal at **Karmani Utsav 2026**, enabling **women entrepreneurs** to sell **handicrafts globally**.
- **Gruha Lakshmi Digital Marketing** portal extension provides **vocational training** and **financial support** linked to **₹2,000 monthly assistance** scheme.
- Karnataka amended its **land laws** to reform **Jamma Bane land records** in **Kodagu**, resolving **long-standing ownership issues**. The reform strengthens **digitisation** under the **Bhoomi Project** and aligns with **modern land governance**.





**Kerala**

- **Chief Justice of India Surya Kant** virtually inaugurated **India's first fully paperless district court system** in **Kalpetta, Wayanad** on **January 6, 2026**, marking **complete transition to digital functioning**. Developed in-house by Kerala High Court and incorporating **AI-based judicial assistance tools**, all proceedings from **filing to judgment** are conducted **electronically** with **AI generating structured summaries**, enabling **interactive Q&A**, supporting **digital annotations**, and **transcribing depositions** via **voice-to-text** with **secure digital signatures**.
- **Justice Soumen Sen** sworn in as **40th Chief Justice of Kerala High Court**, succeeding Justice Nitin Madhukar Jamdar, bringing **20+ years of practice experience**.
- Kerala renamed **Aralam Wildlife Sanctuary** as **Aralam Butterfly Sanctuary**, recognizing region's **rich biodiversity** and **endemic butterfly species**.

**Madhya Pradesh**

- MP Chief Minister **Mohan Yadav** launched '**Swachh Jal Abhiyan**' (**Clean Water Campaign**) with **technology-driven monitoring** and **GIS-based pipeline mapping**.
- **Swachh Jal Abhiyan** conducted in **two phases** (Jan 10-Feb 28, Mar 1-May 31) with **weekly 'Jal Sunwai'** hearings and **CM Helpline (181)**.

**Manipur**

- India's public broadcaster has taken an important step toward **cultural inclusion** in Manipur. **Prasar Bharati** has begun efforts to **resume live radio programmes** in the **Thadou language** from **All India Radio Imphal**. The decision is seen as a **confidence-building measure** in a state affected by **ethnic violence** and highlights the role of **public broadcasting** in **preserving linguistic and cultural diversity**.

**Meghalaya**

- **Justice Revati Mohite-Dere** sworn in as **first woman Chief Justice of Meghalaya HC**, strengthening **gender inclusivity** in **high court judiciary**.

**Odisha**

- The newly formed **Keyi Panyor district** is set to make history by becoming **India's first Bio-Happy District**. This pioneering initiative aims to **integrate biodiversity conservation** with **human well-being**, offering a **new development model** that balances **ecology, livelihoods, and public health**. The project revives the visionary concept of **Biohappiness**, introduced by legendary agricultural scientist **M. S. Swaminathan**.
- **APEDA** inaugurated **Raipur regional office** to boost **exports** of **GI-tagged rice, fortified kernels, and minor forest produce**.

**Rajasthan**

- Rajasthan's **Bamanwas Kankar village** declared **first fully organic village** after adopting **chemical-free farming** and **sustainable agricultural practices**.

**Tamil Nadu**

- Union Minister **Sarbananda Sonowal** launched **port infrastructure and digital governance projects** worth **₹235 crores** on **January 8, 2026**, as part of "**Viksit Bharat, Viksit Ports**" programme at **Chennai Port** (₹129.36 crores) and **Kamarajar Port Limited** (₹105.64 crores). Projects include **coastal revetment strengthening** (₹33.28 crore), **firefighting pump house** (₹43 crore), **hospital modernization** (₹8.08 crore), **SAP-based Enterprise Business System** (₹45 crore), and **Northern Breakwater rehabilitation** (₹105 crore using 3,055 tetrapods), alongside **e-Port Clearance Portal** launch and **₹18 lakh sailing training fund**.
- Tamil Nadu launches **India's first state-backed Quantum Computing Programme** in partnership with **German firm XeedQ GmbH**, implementing in **two phases** (remote access and on-premises).

**Telangana**

- India's **fisheries sector** marked a major **technological milestone** with the launch of a **large-scale trout farming project**. Traditionally limited to **cold Himalayan regions**, **trout cultivation** has now been successfully **adapted to warm inland climate**. The initiative reflects India's push toward **innovation-driven aquaculture, value addition, and export-oriented growth** in fisheries.

**Tripura**

- **Tripura Gramin Bank** launched **India's first solar-powered ATM van 'TGB on Wheels'**, operating **3 solar-powered vans** for rural banking access.
- **CBIC** inaugurated **ICEGATE-LPMS integration** at **Agartala's Integrated Check Post**, enabling **real-time digital data exchange** for customs operations.

**Uttar Pradesh**

- Uttar Pradesh hosted **Regional AI Impact Conference** (Jan 12-13) focusing on **population-scale AI deployment** for **governance and healthcare**.
- **IndiaAI Mission** signed **MoU** with **UPDESCO** to establish **65 Data & AI Labs** across UP, with **two labs** already operational at **NIELIT centers**.

**West Bengal**

- **Indian Navy** to establish **new naval base (detachment)** at **Haldia** on the **Hooghly River** in **January 2026** to strengthen **operational presence** and **maritime surveillance capabilities** in **Bay of Bengal**. Located **130 km** from **Sandheads**, the base leverages **Haldia Dock Complex** with jetty and facilities accommodating **~100 personnel**, primarily supporting **Fast Interceptor Crafts** and **New Water Jet Fast Attack Crafts** for **coastal security, anti-piracy patrols, maritime domain awareness, and humanitarian relief operations**.





**January Month Launches & Inaugurations:**

- **MeitY Approves 22 New Proposals Worth ₹41,863 Crores** - The **Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology** approved **22 additional proposals** worth **₹41,863 crores** under **ECMS** as the third tranche of clearances, bringing cumulative approvals to **46 projects** with total investment of **₹56,567 crore**. The 22 approved companies span **11 key electronics product segments** including **PCBs, capacitors, camera modules, and lithium-ion cells**, with geographical spread across **8 states** including **Andhra Pradesh, Haryana, Karnataka, Maharashtra, and Tamil Nadu**.
- **MoC&I Launches ₹7,295 Crore Financial Interventions for MSME Exports** - The **Directorate General of Foreign Trade** under the **Ministry of Commerce & Industry** launched two critical interventions: **₹5,181 crore interest subvention scheme** for pre and post-shipment export credit and **₹2,114 crore collateral guarantee support** for export credit. Eligible exporters will receive **2.75% base interest subvention** with additional incentives for exports to **under-represented markets**, while collateral guarantee offers **85% coverage** for micro and small exporters and **65%** for medium exporters.
- **PLI Scheme for Textiles Deadline Extended to March 31, 2026** - The **Ministry of Textiles** extended the deadline for fresh applications under the **Production Linked Incentive Scheme for Textiles** from December 31, 2025 to **March 31, 2026**. - **Union Minister JP Nadda Releases 10th Edition of Indian Pharmacopoeia** - On January 2, 2026, Union Minister **Jagat Prakash Nadda** released the **10th edition of the Indian Pharmacopoeia (IP 2026)**, the official compendium of drug standards in India, at **Dr. Ambedkar International Centre** in New Delhi. **IP 2026** added **121 new monographs** totaling **3,340** and introduced **20 monographs for blood components** for **transfusion medicine**, strengthening **drug quality standards** and ensuring safe blood transfusions aligned with national regulatory standards.
- **Indian Army Declares 2026 as 'Year of Networking & Data Centricity'** - The **Indian Army** under **Chief of Army Staff General Upendra Dwivedi** declared **2026** as the **'Year of Networking & Data Centricity'** to drive **digital integration, enhance connectivity, and enable real-time decision-making**. The initiative aims to treat **data as a core operational asset** through **seamless digital connectivity** among soldiers, command centres, sensors, and weapon platforms while operationalising **indigenous communication systems and battlefield management platforms**.
- **Indian Army Launches Community Radio Station 'Radio Sangam' in Rajouri, J&K** - On January 2, 2026, the **Indian Army** in collaboration with civil administration launched

"Radio Sangam", the first community radio station along the **Line of Control** at Keri village in **Rajouri, Jammu and Kashmir**, broadcasting on **88.8 FM**. **Radio Sangam** aims to provide **reliable information, promote local culture**, and strengthen **trust** between the **Indian Army, civil administration, and villagers** through **awareness campaigns, agriculture tips, cultural programs, and interactive shows**.

- **India-Pakistan Exchange Nuclear Lists on January 1, 2026 (35th Time)** - India and Pakistan exchanged the list of **Nuclear Installations and Facilities** through diplomatic channels simultaneously, marking the **35th consecutive exchange** since **January 1, 1992**. Both countries exchanged **prisoner lists** as well, with Pakistan handing over **257 Indian prisoners** including **199 fishermen and 58 civilians**, as mandated under the **1988 Agreement on Prohibition of Attack against Nuclear Installations** and the **2008 consular access pact**.
- **Rakesh Aggarwal (IPS 1994 batch) Appointed as NIA Director General** - Appointed with tenure extending until **August 2028**, leading the **National Investigation Agency** in combating terror and national security threats.
- **Union Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar Launches 'IITM Global Research Foundation' at IIT-Madras** - In January 2026, Union Minister **Dr. S. Jaishankar** launched the **'IITM Global Research Foundation'** at **IIT-Madras** in Chennai to position the institute as the **world's first multinational university**. The initiative includes a dynamic **'plug-and-play' framework** for **technology transfer, joint research projects, and startup expansion**, with **IIT-M** signing **MoUs** with **3 institutions in USA, 1 in UK, 3 in Germany, 3 in UAE, 3 in Asia-Pacific, and 6 under India-for-Global initiative** for initial setup in **USA, Dubai, Malaysia, and Germany**.
- **Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan Releases 184 New Crop Varieties** - On January 4, 2026, Union Minister **Shivraj Singh Chouhan** released **184 newly developed crop varieties** across **25 different crops** at an event in New Delhi, developed by **ICAR (60 varieties), state and central agricultural universities (62 varieties), and private seed companies (62 varieties)**. The varieties include **122 cereals** focused on **climate-resilient millets, 24 cotton varieties, 13 oilseeds, 11 fodder crops, 6 pulses, 6 sugarcane, and individual jute and tobacco varieties** to enhance **agricultural productivity and food security**.
- **42nd Foundation Day of DSIR: Relaxes 3-Year Eligibility Norm for Deep-Tech Startups** - On January 4, 2026, Union Minister of State **Dr. Jitendra Singh** announced removal of the mandatory **3-year existence condition** for **deep-tech startups** to avail maximum **₹1 crore financial assistance** under **DSIR's Industrial Research and Development Promotion Program**. The event also launched **4 new initiatives** including **Guidelines for Recognition of In-House R&D Centres, PRISM Network Platform, Creative India 2025, and DSIR Disaster Management Plan** along with multiple **MoUs** for **technology transfer and skill development**.





- **ICAR-NDRI Developed Karan Fries Cattle Breed** - Through **Holstein Friesian-Tharparkar crossbreeding**, a new breed offering **high milk yield in hot-humid climates** was developed, improving dairy productivity in diverse Indian conditions.
- **Union Minister Rajiv Ranjan Singh Inaugurates SGA Farm and Research Institute in Hyderabad** - On January 5, 2026, Union Minister Rajiv Ranjan Singh inaugurated the **Smart Green Aquaculture (SGA) Farm and Research Institute in Hyderabad, Telangana**, featuring **India's first commercial-scale tropical trout farm and state-of-the-art Recirculating Aquaculture System (RAS) facility**. SGA Limited's project at **Kandukur Mandal** serves as a **live training and demonstration center**, providing **hands-on learning** to youths in **advanced aquaculture systems, automation, monitoring, and biosecurity practices** for sustainable fish farming.
- **Gol Approves Nutrient-Based Subsidy Rates for Rabi 2025–26 Season** - Government of India approved **Nutrient-Based Subsidy rates for Rabi 2025-26 season effective October 1, 2025 to March 31, 2026** with estimated budgetary requirement of **₹37,952.29 crore**. **NBS rates set at ₹43.02 per kg for Nitrogen, ₹47.96 per kg for Phosphorus, ₹2.38 per kg for Potassium, and ₹2.87 per kg for Sulphur**, with Gol raising **DAP subsidy to ₹29,805 per MT** from ₹21,911 in Rabi 2024-25, while domestic P&K fertilizer production increased over 50% from **112.19 LMT in 2014 to 168.55 LMT by December 2025**.

**INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS**

- USA Withdraws from 66 International Bodies Including India-led ISA** - On January 7, 2026, USA President **Donald Trump** issued an executive order and presidential memorandum announcing **withdrawal from 66 international organizations, treaties, and commissions** including **India-and-France-led International Solar Alliance** and several **UN-affiliated entities**. The withdrawal covers **35 non-UN organizations** and **31 UN-affiliated bodies** including **IRENA, IPCC, IUCN, UNFCCC, UNFPA, and UN Water**, with USA formally exiting **ISA** ending approximately **USD 2.1 million contributions** made between 2022-2025 as part of "America First" review citing concerns over **national sovereignty** and **resource use**.
- UNGA Declares 2026 as International Year for Rangelands and Pastoralists** - In January 2026, the **United Nations General Assembly** declared **2026 as the International Year of Rangelands and Pastoralists (IYRP)** at its 76th session, with resolution led by **Mongolia** and backed by **60 Member States** and **Food and Agriculture Organisation** as leading implementing agency. **IYRP 2026** aims to **share pastoralist knowledge, encourage innovation, build partnerships, and support policies** for **sustainable rangelands and livelihoods**, emphasizing that **rangelands covering 50% of Earth's land surface** support **over 2 billion people** and **50% of world's livestock** while playing pivotal role in **biodiversity conservation** and **climate resilience**.
- Archaeologists in Pakistan Discover 2,000-Year-Old Kushan Empire Coins** - Archaeologists in **Pakistan** have discovered **2,000-year-old Kushan Empire coins** and **lapis lazuli fragments** at **Bhir Mound near Taxila in Rawalpindi**. The coins belong to the era of **King Vasudeva**, one of the **last great Kushan rulers**. The discovery highlights the region's **ancient trade links, religious diversity, and historical importance** during the **early centuries of the Common Era**.
- German Chancellor Friedrich Merz's First Asia Visit to India (January 12-13, 2026)** - **German Chancellor Friedrich Merz** is set to visit **India on January 12 and 13, 2026** at a crucial time for **India-Germany relations**, with both countries seeking **deeper cooperation in trade, technology, climate action, and global governance**. The visit includes **Sabarmati Ashram** and **India-Germany CEO Forum in Ahmedabad**, followed by **Bengaluru** featuring **IISc's CeNSE center** and **Bosch campus** showcasing **scientific research** and **sustainable mobility initiatives**, expected to further strengthen **strategic and economic engagement**.
- India Launches e-B-4 Visa Category for Chinese Nationals** - **India** has launched a new **electronic business visa category** called the **e-B-4 Visa (e Production Investment Business Visa)** to **simplify and regulate business travel** for **Chinese nationals**, aiming to support **legitimate business activities** and respond to **rising demand for structured business engagement** between **India and China**.





- **India-China Bilateral Trade Crossed \$155.62 Billion in 2025** - India-China bilateral trade crossed \$155.62 billion in 2025 despite recording a record \$116.12 billion deficit, reflecting significant trade imbalance concerns and highlighting the need for balanced trade mechanisms between the two economies.
- **China Commissions New Advanced Warship 'Loudi'** - China has recently strengthened its naval power by commissioning a new advanced warship named Loudi, highlighting how quickly the Chinese Navy is expanding its fleet in order to match or challenge the naval strength of the United States.
- **Italy Confers Order of the Star of Italy on Goa Industrialist** - Italy conferred the prestigious Order of the Star of Italy on Goa industrialist Shrinivas Dempo for fostering India-Italy business and cultural ties, recognizing his significant contributions to bilateral relations.
- **India and Germany Signed Joint Declaration on Telecommunications Cooperation** - In January 2026, India and Germany signed a Joint Declaration on Telecommunications Cooperation covering policy, regulation, manufacturing, innovation, and global digital engagement, strengthening bilateral technological partnership and digital collaboration.
- **Israel Announces Withdrawal from Seven UN Agencies** - Israel announces withdrawal from seven UN agencies, citing alleged bias, affecting humanitarian and development programs globally and raising concerns about international cooperation.
- **USA Freezes Immigrant Visa Processing for 75 Countries** - USA freezes immigrant visa processing for 75 countries with implementation expected from January 21, 2026, impacting hundreds of thousands of visa applicants worldwide.
- **Yemen's PM Salem bin Breik Resigned** - Yemen's PM Salem bin Breik resigned, with Foreign Minister Shaya Mohsen Zindani appointed to form new cabinet amid ongoing political crisis in the country.
- **WEF Global Risks Report 2026 Flags Geoeconomic Confrontation as Top Threat** - The World Economic Forum's Global Risks Report 2026 flags geoeconomic confrontation as the top short-term threat based on insights from 1,300+ expert views, highlighting growing tensions in international economic relations.
- **Australian Universities Planning Bengaluru Campuses** - The University of New South Wales (UNSW), Australia is planning a Bengaluru campus offering undergraduate programmes in commerce, media, computer science, and data science, along with postgraduate programmes in cybersecurity. The University of Liverpool and Lancaster University are also planning Bengaluru campuses to expand access to international higher education in India.
- **Australia's Finke River Recognised as World's Oldest Flowing River** - Australia's Finke (Larapinta) River, aged 300–400 million years, is recognised as the world's oldest flowing river. Its path through the MacDonnell Ranges confirms it predates the mountain formation, making it a geological marvel.
- **Nobel Institute Clarifies Maria Corina Machado Cannot Transfer Prize Medal** - Although Maria Corina Machado symbolically handed her Nobel Peace Prize medal to Donald Trump, the Nobel Institute clarified that prizes cannot be transferred or shared. Machado remains the sole official laureate, and the symbolic gesture does not alter the official status of the award.

- **ADB Approves ₹4,100 Crore Loan for Musi Riverfront Development in Telangana** - On January 2, 2026, the Asian Development Bank granted in-principle approval for ₹4,100 crore (USD 500 million) loan to Telangana for Phase-I of the Musi Riverfront Development Project to rejuvenate the river and enhance ecological, social, and economic aspects. Phase-I covers 21 kilometres of Zone-I stretching from Osman Sagar to Babu Ghat, executed by Musi Riverfront Development Corporation Limited, with Phase-I works to begin after cost estimates finalization by March 31, 2026.
- **FSS Becomes First Payments Company in India, ME, APAC, SA to Receive ISO/IEC 42001 Certification** - On January 6, 2026, Financial Software and Systems became the first payments company in India, Middle East, Asia-Pacific, and South Africa to earn the ISO/IEC 42001 Certification, the world's first international standard for Artificial Intelligence Management Systems. The certification highlights FSS's commitment to responsible and trustworthy use of AI across digital payments platforms, ensuring responsible and ethical AI use with structured governance framework and mitigating risks such as bias and regulatory non-compliance.
- **NSO Releases FAE of GDP 2025-26; Real GDP Witnesses 7.4% Growth in FY26** - On January 7, 2026, National Statistics Office released First Advance Estimates of GDP for FY26 with real GDP estimated at 7.4% growth against 6.5% in FY25, with real GDP at ₹201.90 lakh crore. Nominal GDP growth projected at 8% in FY26 lower than previous year's 10.4%, with real GVA estimated at ₹184.50 lakh crore against ₹171.87 lakh crore in FY25 registering 7.3% growth rate and nominal GVA at ₹323.48 lakh crore recording 7.7% growth rate showing strong economic momentum.
- **SBI Research Projects India's FY26 GDP Growth at 7.5%** - On January 7, 2026, State Bank of India's Economic Research Department released Ecowrap report projecting India's GDP growth for FY26 at 7.5% with upward bias, slightly above NSO's 7.4% first advance estimate and RBI's 7.3% projection. Real GDP estimated at ₹201.90 lakh crore growing 7.4% and nominal GDP projected to expand 8% to ₹357.13-357.14 lakh crore.
- **Ind-Ra Projects Indian Economy to Grow 6.9% in FY27 Amid Global Headwinds** - In January 2026, India Ratings and Research projected India's GDP growth at 6.9% for FY27, lower than estimated 7.4% for FY26, attributed to El Nino pattern from mid-2026, weak investments, sluggish global trade growth, and base effect changes. Private Financial Consumption Expenditure remained subdued at 5.6% in FY24 but surged to 7.2% in FY25 and improved to 7.5% in H1 FY26, with projection of 7.6% growth in FY27.
- **UN-DESA Projects India's GDP Growth at 6.6% for 2026** - In January 2026, United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs released 'World Economic Situation and Prospects (WESP) 2026' report projecting India's GDP growth at 6.6% for calendar year 2026 down from earlier 7.4% estimate and forecasting 6.7% for 2027, with India remaining world's fastest-growing major economy. Global growth expected to moderate to 2.7% in 2026 down from 2.8% in 2025.
- **NITI Aayog Launches 5th Edition of 'Trade Watch Quarterly' Report** - In January 2026, Dr. Arvind Virmani, Member of NITI Aayog, launched the 5th edition of Trade Watch Quarterly for Q1 FY26 providing comprehensive data-driven analysis of India's trade performance. The report focused on India's automotive exports sector with global auto-components market reaching USD 856 billion in 2024 growing at 3% CAGR while India's exports nearly doubled from USD 8.2 billion to USD 16.9 billion achieving faster 7% CAGR.
- **Indian Railways Electrified about 99.2% of its Network by November 2025** - In January 2026, Indian Railways under Ministry of Railways electrified 99.2% (69,427 Route Kilometres) of its 70,001 RKM broad-gauge network by November 2025, emerging as one of world's most extensively electrified rail systems. Electrification expanded from 1.4 km per day (2004-14) to over 15 km per day (2019-2025), with solar power capacity surged nearly 244 times from 3.68 MW in 2014 to 898 MW by November 2025.
- **HPCL Commissions World's First LC-Max Residue Upgradation Facility in Visakhapatnam** - On January 5, 2026, Hindustan Petroleum Corporation successfully commissioned world's first and largest Liquid Conversion-Maximum Residue Upgradation Facility at its Visakhapatnam Refinery in Andhra Pradesh as part of ₹31,407 crore Visakh Refinery Modernization Project. The facility with 3.55 MTPA capacity can convert 93% of low-value bottom-of-barrel oils into higher-value products like diesel and jet fuel using three massive 2,200-tonne reactors.
- **Morgan Stanley Projects India's GDP Growth at 7.6% for FY26 and 6.5% for FY27** - Morgan Stanley projects India's GDP at 7.6% for FY26 and 6.5% for FY27, driven by fiscal-monetary policy support and rising household incomes, with widespread Capex pickup due to rising investor confidence boosting private investment.
- **World Bank Projects India's FY27 GDP at 6.5%** - World Bank projects India's FY27 GDP at 6.5% with FY28 expected at 6.6% aided by services recovery and investment pickup, noting domestic demand expected to drive growth amid continued tariff and global uncertainty. World Bank projects global growth at 2.6% in CY26, down from 2.7% in CY25.
- **India's Fish Production Doubled in Decade to 197.75 Lakh Tonnes in FY25** - India's fish production doubled in decade to 197.75 lakh tonnes in FY25, up 106% from 95.79 lakh tonnes in FY14, making India world's second-largest fish producer.
- **India's Seafood Exports Hit All-Time High of ₹62,408 Crore in FY25** - India's seafood exports hit all-time high of ₹62,408 crore (USD 7.45 billion) in FY25, with value-added exports rising 56% over five years.





- **India's Retail Inflation Climbed to 3-Month High of 1.33% in December 2025** - India's retail inflation climbed to 3-month high of 1.33% in December 2025, rising from 0.71% in November but below RBI's 2% threshold. Food inflation registers negative growth for 7th consecutive month at -2.71%, while core inflation surges to 27-month high of 4.45%.
- **India's Foreign Exchange Reserves Increased by \$392 Million to \$687.19 Billion** - India's foreign exchange reserves increased by \$392 million to \$687.19 billion, supported by a rise in gold reserves. The strong reserve position enhances external stability and investor confidence.
- **India-China Trade Deficit Hits Record \$116.12 Billion in 2025** - India-China bilateral trade crossed \$155.62 billion in 2025 despite recording a record \$116.12 billion deficit, reflecting heavy dependence on Chinese imports and need for balanced trade mechanisms.
- **Female Labor Force Participation Reached 35.3% in December 2025** - Female labor force participation reached 35.3% in December 2025, marking yearly high in employment metrics.
- **PFRDA Constituted High-Level Committee for NPS Assured Payouts** - PFRDA constituted 15-member high-level committee headed by M.S. Sahoo to formulate assured payouts framework under National Pension System with standardized disclosures preventing mis-selling and clarifying 'assured' vs market-linked returns.
- **TVS Supply Chain Solutions Appointed Vikas Chadha as Global CEO** - TVS Supply Chain Solutions appointed Vikas Chadha as Global CEO effective January 22, 2026 for global growth and logistics execution.
- **Indusfood 2026 Featured 2,200 Exhibitors from 30+ Countries** - Indusfood 2026 featured 2,200 exhibitors from 30+ countries with 15,000+ buyers from 120+ countries, adding Pet Food and Cookware pavilions reflecting changing global demand for wellness and premium products.
- **APEDA Launched BHARATI Startup Challenge** - APEDA launched BHARATI Startup Challenge promoting innovation in agricultural and processed food export sectors.




