ISRO's Successfully Lift Off Anomaly in PS3 Stage of PSLV-C62/EOS-N1 Mission

India's PSLV-C62 rocket carrying the EOS-N1 satellite encountered an anomaly during the final phase of its third stage on January 12, 2026. The launch took place from Sriharikota after a 22.5 hour countdown. While initial stages performed normally, deviations in roll rate and flight path were observed, prompting ISRO to begin a detailed technical analysis.

Why in News?

The PSLV-C62/EOS-N1 mission faced a technical anomaly near the end of the PS3 stage. ISRO confirmed that the issue led to deviations in the rocket's trajectory, and further assessment of mission data is in progress.

Mission Overview and Launch Details

The PSLV-C62/EOS-N1 mission followed a 22.5-hour countdown before lifting off from Sriharikota, marking the 105th launch from the spaceport and the 64th flight of the PSLV. The mission used the PSLV-DL variant, which features two strap-on boosters, and was the fifth flight of this configuration.

EOS-N1, an Earth observation satellite built for strategic applications, was the primary payload. The launch was a commercial mission executed by NewSpace India Limited (NSIL), ISRO's commercial arm. Alongside EOS-N1, 15 co-passenger satellites developed by startups and academic institutions from India and abroad were onboard, reflecting India's growing role in the global small satellite launch market.

Planned Mission Profile

Under the original mission plan, EOS-N1 and 14 of the co-passenger satellites were to be injected into a Sun Synchronous Orbit (SSO). The remaining payload, the KID capsule developed by Orbital Paradigm (Spain) in collaboration with RIDE (France), was intended for a re-entry experiment.

Following satellite deployment, the PS4 stage was scheduled to restart to de-boost itself and enter a re-entry trajectory. Both the PS4 stage and the KID capsule were expected to re-enter Earth's atmosphere and impact the South Pacific Ocean. ISRO has not yet confirmed whether these objectives were achieved.

What Did ISRO Say About the Anomaly?

ISRO Chairman V Narayanan stated that a deviation was noticed during the third stage of the rocket. He clarified that mission data is currently being analysed and that ISRO will share detailed findings soon. At present, the mission has not been officially declared a success or failure.

Key Payloads and Strategic Importance

One of the major satellites onboard was Anvesha, a surveillance satellite developed by the Defence Research and Development Organization. Anvesha is designed to provide advanced imaging capabilities, enhancing India's ability to monitor and map strategic locations with high precision, which is vital for national security and disaster management.

Role of the Private Space Sector

The mission marked a milestone for India's private space ecosystem. For the first time, a single private company, Dhruva Space from Hyderabad, contributed seven satellites to a PSLV mission. This highlights the growing collaboration between ISRO and private players following space sector reforms.

WEF Global Risks Report 2026

The **World Economic Forum (WEF) Global Risks Report 2026 (21st edition)** paints a worrying picture of the coming decade. The report suggests that the world is moving into an **"Age of Competition"**, where rivalry between countries is intensifying—not only in the military space, but also through **trade restrictions, sanctions, technology controls, and information warfare**. This shift is creating a global environment where shocks spread faster, cooperation becomes harder, and societies become more vulnerable to instability.

The report ranks risks across **two key time horizons**—the near future (2 years) and the long term (10 years). Its core message is straightforward: the global landscape is becoming **more fragmented, more unpredictable, and more exposed to multiple overlapping risks**.

1) What Does WEF Mean by "Global Risk"?

WEF defines a **global risk** as a threat or event that can cause major negative impact on a large scale, affecting:

- **the world's population**
- **the global economy**
- **natural resources and ecological systems**

This definition matters because it places emphasis on threats that cross borders, spread rapidly, and create ripple effects across regions.

2) How the Report Is Built

The report is primarily based on expert perceptions collected through global surveys of leaders and specialists across sectors. It then organizes risks into categories such as:

- **Geopolitical**
- **Economic**
- **Societal**
- **Technological**
- **Environmental**

It also studies how risks connect with each other, showing that crises rarely happen in isolation. Instead, one major event often triggers several others.

3) Global Mood: Instability Is Rising

A major finding of the report is that a large share of experts expects the world to experience **turbulence** in both the short and long term. This suggests that many see current tensions as part of deeper structural changes rather than temporary fluctuations.

Main reasons behind the growing instability include:

- rising rivalry between major powers
- shrinking space for international cooperation
- economic pressures such as high debt and uneven growth
- rapid technological disruptions
- intensifying climate impacts

4) Most Likely Crisis Trigger in 2026: Goeconomic Confrontation

The report identifies **goeconomic confrontation** as the most likely risk to trigger a global crisis in 2026.

What goeconomic confrontation means

It refers to the use of economic tools as instruments of strategic power, such as:

- sanctions and counter-sanctions
- tariffs and trade barriers
- restrictions on technology exports
- control over supply chains
- manipulation of critical resources (oil, gas, rare earth minerals, chips)

Why it is dangerous

Goeconomic rivalry:

- disrupts global trade networks
- increases inflationary pressures
- reduces investment confidence
- weakens global supply chains
- creates uncertainty for industries and jobs

In today's world, economic rivalry is becoming as destabilizing as direct military confrontation.

5) Conflict and Security: The Risk of Armed Escalation

Along with economic rivalry, the report highlights **state-based armed conflict** as a leading risk. Conflicts today have grown more complex because they often combine:

- conventional warfare
- cyberattacks
- economic sanctions
- information manipulation

Key concerns linked to armed conflict

- damage to infrastructure and energy networks
- global commodity price instability
- increase in displacement and migration
- rising military expenditure at the cost of development spending

6) Information Crisis: Misinformation, Disinformation, and Polarization

One of the strongest warnings in the report is the growing influence of **misinformation and disinformation**, especially through digital platforms. The report links false information with **social unrest and political division**.

How misinformation becomes a global threat

It leads to:

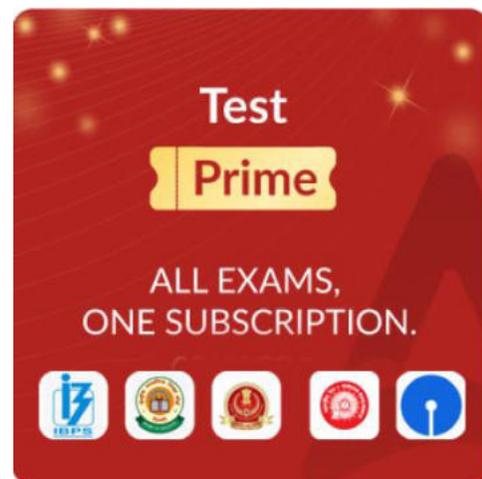

Henley Passport Index 2026

The **Henley Passport Index 2026** once again highlights the sharp divide in global travel freedom, ranking passports based on how many destinations their holders can visit without needing a visa in advance. India’s global travel access has seen a modest improvement in 2026. According to the latest passport rankings, Indian travellers can now visit more countries without lengthy visa procedures than last year. However, significant limitations remain for popular destinations like Europe and North America, shaping how Indians plan international trips. Why in the News?

The Henley Passport Index 2026 has ranked **India at 80th position globally**. Indian passport holders get visa free, visa-on-arrival or e-visa access to 55 destinations, up from last year’s rank of 85.

India’s Rank in the Henley Passport Index 2026

- India is ranked 80th in the Henley Passport Index 2026. Indian passport holders currently enjoy visa-free or visa-on-arrival access to 55 destinations.
- India shares this position with Nigeria and Algeria, while regional neighbours Bangladesh and Pakistan rank even lower.
- The data reflects a significant mobility gap within South Asia and between India and leading global economies.

World's Most Powerful Passports in 2026

- At the top of the rankings, Singapore holds the number one position, with its citizens enjoying visa-free or visa-on-arrival access to 192 destinations, the highest in the world.
- Japan and South Korea jointly occupy the second position with access to 188 destinations, reflecting their strong diplomatic networks and stable international relations.
- Europe continues to dominate the upper ranks, with multiple EU countries offering access to over 185 destinations, highlighting the strength of European diplomacy and integration.

Which Country Has the Weakest Passport in the World?

- Afghanistan (Rank 101) – 24 destinations
- Afghanistan holds the weakest passport globally, allowing access to just 24 destinations without a prior visa.
- It is followed closely by Syria and Iraq, underscoring how conflict, political instability, and security concerns sharply limit international mobility.
- The gap between the most powerful passport (Singapore) and the weakest (Afghanistan) now stands at 168 destinations.

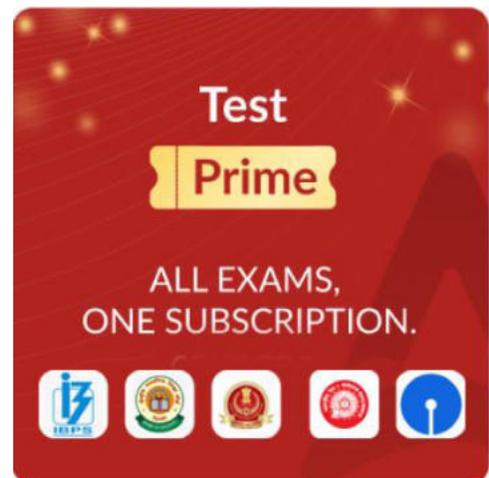

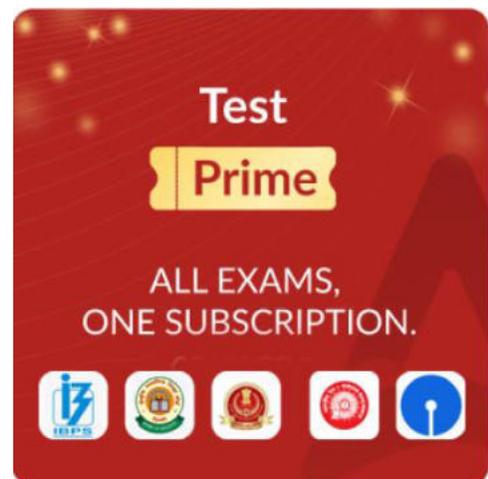

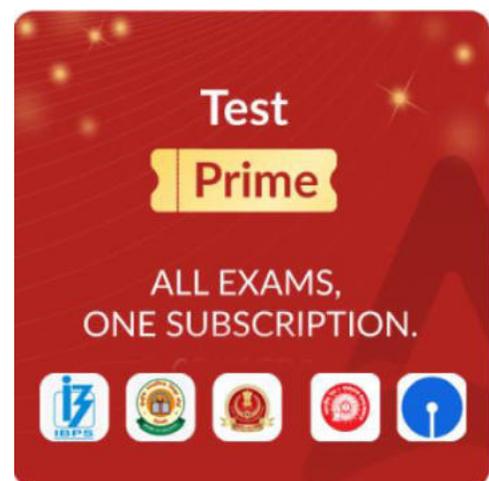
