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Q1. In which year did Ali Khamenei become Supreme Leader of Iran?

- (a) 1979
- (b) 1981
- (c) 1989
- (d) 1999

Ans.(c)

Sol. Answer: (c) 1989

Solution: Ali Khamenei became Supreme Leader in 1989 after the death of revolutionary founder Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini. The post is a lifetime position under Iran's Constitution and holds ultimate authority over the state.

Information Booster :

- Supreme Leader is the highest authority in Iran.
- Commander-in-Chief of Armed Forces.
- Controls foreign policy, judiciary head, and state broadcasting.
- Above the elected President in power hierarchy.
- Khamenei remained in office for over three-and-a-half decades.

Q2. Which protest movement during 2022–23 significantly challenged Iran's ruling system?

- (a) Green Movement
- (b) Arab Spring
- (c) Woman, Life, Freedom Movement
- (d) Islamic Awakening

Ans.(c)

Sol. Answer: (c) Woman, Life, Freedom Movement

Solution: The 2022–23 "Woman, Life, Freedom" movement began after the death of Mahsa Amini in police custody and evolved into nationwide protests against strict social laws and the political system.

Information Booster:

- Triggered by alleged violation of hijab law.
- Major participation of women and youth.
- Led to nationwide demonstrations.
- Security forces suppressed protests.
- Highlighted internal instability in Iran

Q3. Which constitutional body appoints the Supreme Leader of Iran?

- (a) Parliament (Majlis)
- (b) Guardian Council
- (c) Assembly of Experts

Ans.(c)

Sol. Answer: (c) Assembly of Experts

Solution: The Assembly of Experts, a clerical body elected by the public, is constitutionally empowered to appoint and supervise the Supreme Leader. It selected Khamenei in 1989.

Information Booster:

- Members are Islamic scholars.
- Can theoretically remove the Supreme Leader.
- Key pillar of Iran's theocratic structure.
- Reflects Iran's system combining democracy and clerical rule.

Q4. Which group was blamed for the 1981 assassination attempt on Khamenei?

- (a) Hezbollah
- (b) People's Mujahedin of Iran (MEK)
- (c) Taliban

Ans.(b)

Sol. Answer: (b) People's Mujahedin of Iran (MEK)

Solution: In 1981, Khamenei survived a bomb attack that left his right arm partially paralysed. Iranian authorities blamed the People's Mujahedin of Iran (MEK), an outlawed opposition group.

Information Booster:

- MEK initially supported 1979 Revolution.
- Later turned against the regime.
- Declared illegal inside Iran.
- Incident increased regime crackdown on dissidents.

Q5. Before becoming Supreme Leader, which key position did Khamenei hold?

- (a) Prime Minister
- (b) President of Iran
- (c) Chief Justice
- (d) Foreign Minister

Ans.(b)

Sol. Answer: (b) President of Iran

Solution: Khamenei served as President of Iran from 1981 to 1989 before assuming the role of Supreme Leader.

Information Booster:

- Presidency is an elected executive post.
- Real authority lies with Supreme Leader.
- Served during Iran-Iraq War period.
- Strengthened ties with security institutions.
