The NASA Apollo 8 mission to the moon captured the iconic earthrise image the same year in which U.S. forces were responsible for the My Lai massacre in Vietnam. Similarly, on April 6, as the crew of the NASA Artemis II mission swung around the moon in their spacecraft, they photographed the earth rising above the lunar limb — an earthset — only months after the first casualty of coordinated strikes by the U.S. and Israel against Iran was a girls' primary school. The Refugees International president called it "likely the largest number of child casualties in a single U.S. military attack" since My Lai.

In Washington, the administration was simultaneously dismantling legal protections for immigrants, imposing tariffs which fall afoul of trade law, and enabling an Israeli military campaign in Gaza that the International Court of Justice has been scrutinising for genocide since January 2024. Thus, the country that asks the world to celebrate humankind's return to the moon has demonstrated a simultaneous contempt for human rights and international law.

The International Commission of Jurists and the Red Cross have found that U.S. and Israeli forces have struck multiple sites protected by international humanitarian law. In 2025, a UN commission confirmed that Israel was responsible for the ongoing _____ (A) in Gaza, and the International Criminal Court issued arrest warrants for Israel's prime minister and former defence minister for war crimes. However, the U.S. continued to supply arms to Israel and responded to the warrants with sanctions against officials.

Additionally, the U.S. administration has deported Venezuelan migrants, many with no gang affiliation, to **notorious** prisons — a process that the U.S. Supreme Court said violated due process rights

All these actions are of a nation whose principal policy is unmitigated (self-interest), commitments be damned. Given the sustained manner in which the U.S. has applied this policy, it **supervenes** the universalism NASA invoked when it called its Artemis II mission "humanity's return to the moon". In 2015, the U.S. passed a law that allows its citizens to possess, use, and sell resources (extracted) from the moon, and which the Artemis Accords use as a governing norm. Legal expert Christopher Newman has argued that the Accords are thus a (mechanism) for the U.S. to (force other countries) to accept its interpretation of resource rights. The lunar south pole contains water ice that can be used to make rocket fuel, but it is available only in finite quantities.

The Accords also introduce "safety zones" around lunar sites **ostensibly** to prevent harmful interference. They could in practice create (exclusion zones) around (resource-rich areas), allowing early movers to consolidate control without formally violating the Outer Space Treaty.

The U.S.'s space governance framework is more transparent than China's. The Accords also articulate principles of peaceful use and emergency assistance. However, the more important question is whether we should allow either power to set the rules unilaterally for a domain that belongs to all of humankind. The Accords sidestep the multilateral process of the UN Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space in favour of forging bilateral agreements.

If the U.S. expects to be a credible leader in space, it must pursue treaty-level rules on lunar resources that give all nations a meaningful stake.

Massacre

Sprawling stadiums and state-of-the-art training facilities aren't the only things that go into the making of a sporting nation with grand ambitions. Behind the impressive **facade** of modern infrastructure, the house needs to be squeaky clean. The alarmingly long list of those who have been caught doping **can't be brushed under the carpet**. India was made to realise this by the Athletics Integrity Unit (AIU), an independent anti-doping watchdog founded by World Athletics, when it flagged its inadequate anti-doping programme. It was also a wake-up call for the government and sports officials tasked with preparing a pitch for the country to host the 2036 Olympics. The International Olympic Committee members, and rivals who are in the race to host the Games, won't be blind to India being one of the top two nations globally for doping offences in athletics from 2022 to 2025.

Downgrading the Athletics Federation of India, the AIU had said that the Indian athletes were "extremely high" risk of doping. This translates to India's track-and-field participants in international events being made to undergo mandatory and extensive testing. This was a setback to a nation that had carved a new image for itself when Neeraj Chopra won the javelin gold at the 2021 Tokyo Olympics. Pulling down the new emerging athletic nation are the doping test results at India's junior and senior national and state-level competitions. There has been **rampant** use of performance-enhancing drugs among those aspiring to get government jobs or hoping for monetary incentives for state- and district-level winners.

Whenever India has found itself cornered because of a high-profile doping scandal or a rap by international anti-doping bodies for not doing enough, it has come up with familiar but ineffective solutions. There is talk about educating the athletes, conducting talk sessions and making them aware of the health risks. While those seminars and workshops should continue, more needs to be done. A part of what is spent on big sporting infrastructure projects needs to be channelled to anti-doping programmes. Unless a holistic plan to curb doping from the grassroots to the top level is carefully formulated and rigorously implemented, including targeted out-of-competition testing, the stain of doping won't go away. This is a **dubious** podium, and India doesn't need to be on it.
