Q1. What is the total financial outlay (worth) allocated for the Maharashtra rural healthcare campaign in 2026?

Sol. The correct answer is (b) Rs. 65.25 crore

- The budget supports the strengthening of health services in remote areas where private healthcare is often unavailable or expensive.
- The funds are also used to provide proper nutrition and manage infectious diseases within the rural population.
- The allocation facilitates the formation of monitoring committees to ensure transparency in spending at the village level.

Information Booster:

Additional Knowledge:

- Rs. 100 crore (Option a): This is a rounded figure often used for large projects but does not match the specific audited amount of Rs. 65.25 crore for this scheme.
- Rs. 50.75 crore (Option c): An incorrect figure; factual data from state releases confirms the budget exceeded this amount.
- Rs. 25.50 crore (Option d): This amount would be insufficient to cover a state-wide movement involving thousands of villages in Maharashtra.

- The scheme also addresses mental health and lifestyle-related diseases, which are becoming increasingly prevalent in rural settings.
- By strengthening the system of implementation, the government ensures that medical aid reaches the "last mile" of the state.

Information Booster:

- The campaign utilizes a multi-level committee system, ranging from the state level down to the village level, for strict monitoring.
- Villages that meet the prescribed health standards successfully will be honored with the title of "Arogyasampann Gaon."

Additional Knowledge:

- Urban Hospitals (Option a): The scheme is strictly rural-centric, focusing on decentralizing healthcare away from crowded cities.
- Industrial Workers (Option b): While workers' health is important, this scheme is a geographical initiative for all village residents, not an occupational insurance plan.
- Digital Libraries (Option d): This falls under the "Digital India" or education sector, whereas this campaign is strictly under the Health Ministry.

- It seeks to make quality medical treatment available to citizens near their homes, specifically targeting those in remote and rural areas.

- The launch took place on World Health Day, which is celebrated globally every year on April 7th (the report date reflects the post-launch publication).

Additional Knowledge:

- Narendra Modi (Option a): While the PM often launches national schemes, state-specific initiatives like this are typically inaugurated by the Chief Minister.
- Union Health Minister (Option c): The Union Minister handles national policy, while the State Health Minister (Prakash Abitkar) was the one present at this state-level event.
- Governor (Option d): The Governor is the ceremonial head, but executive actions and policy launches are performed by the elected Chief Minister.

- The choice of this day emphasizes the state's alignment with global health goals, such as Universal Health Coverage.
- The 2026 launch specifically focused on "Arogyasampann" (Health-wealthy) status for every village.
- By launching on this day, the government aimed to garner maximum public attention and participation for the healthcare drive.

Information Booster:

- World Health Day themes usually focus on a specific health priority; the state initiative mirrored this by focusing on rural equity and accessibility.
- The campaign is designed to be a sustained movement, with performance-based awards for villages.

Additional Knowledge:

- World Environment Day (Option a): Observed on June 5th, focusing on ecology and pollution, not specifically on medical service delivery.
- World Water Day (Option b): Observed on March 22nd, focusing on freshwater resources. While water is part of the health scheme, it wasn't the launch occasion.
- International Yoga Day (Option d): Observed on June 21st, focusing on physical and mental well-being through yoga, rather than institutional rural healthcare services.
