Explanation:

The correct answer is 'None of the above'.

★ Key Points

- After going through the above sentence we find that:
 - **Part B** talks about operational risk which is not relevant to the context.
 - So, the odd part is **B**.
 - The sentence should begin with **C** followed by **A** as it mentions the action taken by large public sector banks.
 - The next part should be **E** because it mentions the reason behind the action.
 - The last part is **D**. It concludes the sentence by elaborating the previous part.
 - Therefore, the sentences should be rearranged as **CAED**.
 - So, none of the options is correct. Hence, **option 4** is the answer.

Thus, the correct sentence will be : *Large public-sector banks have in the last few months moved to hire retired bankers and defence personnel in a bid to lower operational costs as also to seek advice while expanding the reach of some specific product categories .*

★ Additional Information

Personnel : people employed in an organization

Emerged : came out

2. Answer: c

Explanation:

The correct answer is ACEB.

★ Key Points

- Reading the above sentence we find that:
 - The statement talks about India's investment plans of Amazon and Walmart.
 - Part D talks about **budget highlights** which is completely out of context here.
 - Thus, we find that the odd part is D.
 - Now looking at the rest of the options, we find that **Part A** should be the first part of the sentence. The next fragment should talk about something being revised and PART C talks about that thing .
 - The next part should talk about the Indian investment plans and **Part B** concludes the sentence by stating those plans thereby forming a logical and coherent sentence.
- Only, ACEB is able to make a coherent sentence.

Therefore, the correct answer is ACEB.

Thus the correct sentence will be : *The U.S. government is concerned about India's revised e-commerce regulations and has told that the policy will hinder the Indian investment plans of Amazon.com and Walmart Inc.*

★ Additional Information

- Concern: a matter of interest or importance to someone
- Regulations: an official rule or the act of controlling something
- Hinder: make it difficult for (someone) to do something or for (something) to happen

3. Answer: b

Explanation:

The correct answer is DACEB.

★ Key Points

While arranging the parts of the sentence given in options, we have to find some grammatical or contextual connections between them, so let's find out.

- Part D establishes the 'subject' of the sentence which is concerned with the topic 'caffeine'.
- The word 'caffeine' is explained in part A, which should follow part D.
- We now have 3 parts left, parts B, C and D.
- Through observation, we can infer that parts E and B form a simultaneous pair - 'the most ... on Earth' which is a clause.
- To attach this clause to parts D and A we need to insert part C in between.

Thus, the correct order is DACEB.

Correct sentence: "Caffeine, the stimulant in coffee, has been called the most widely used psychoactive substance on Earth."

4. Answer: b

Explanation:

The passage is about Mark Zuckerberg's company Facebook.

The correct order is DAEC.

D is 1st as it introduces the topic. A is 2nd as it answers the question "another what?" - another US presidential election year. E is 3rd as it answers the question "intense what?" - intense political pressure. C is 4th as it provides us with additional relevant information.

Sentence B is the odd one out as it doesn't fit with the theme of the paragraph.

Hence the correct answer is option 2.

Sentence: Mark Zuckerberg's company may be gearing up for another US presidential election year after 12 months of intense political pressure - over tax, privacy and the

hijacking of its platform by foreign powers

5. Answer: a

Explanation:

The correct answer is **option 1** i.e. EDABC.

★ Explanation

- **First is D** as it establishes the subject i.e. upper regions on the mountains. **Dis** the only opening segment that can lead to the formation of a meaningful and grammatically correct sentence.
- **Next is E** as it states what's happening to the upper mountain regions.
- **A** is next as it mentions the consequence of this.
- **Next is B** as it tells where the animal species are migrating to.
- **Last is C** as it mentions the effect of migration.

Correct sentence- *As the upper regions on the mountains become warmer, plant and animal species are migrating up the slope, causing further disturbance in the ecosystem.*

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6. Answer: e

Explanation:

The correct answer is '**None of the above**'.

★ Key Points

- Instead of trying to find the beginning or end, which may be time-consuming, it is easier to find connections within parts and then eliminate the options.
- Part E ends with the article 'the', indicating that the next word must be a noun/adjective.

- Only options A and C begin with a noun. Since the part mentions a 'tussle' between two parties, 'centre' and 'state' fit better than 'schemes'.
- So, EC is the correct order.
- C ends with 'with regard', which must be followed by the preposition 'to', as given by D. So, ECD.
- D ends with the noun 'welfare', which can only fit before 'schemes', given by A. So, ECDA.
- The correct sequence is: **ECDAB** , which is reflected by none of the given options.

Therefore, the correct answer is option 5.

7. Answer: a

Explanation:

The correct answer is **option 1 i.e. ADCBE.**

★ Explanation

- **First is A** as it establishes the subject i.e. glaciers. **A** is the only opening segment that can lead to the formation of a meaningful and grammatically correct sentence.
- **Next is D** as it tells the effects of melting glaciers.
- **C follows D** by introducing a new topic- changing weather patterns.
- **Next is B** as it mentions the effect of changing weather patterns.
- **Last is E** as it tells the effects of incessant rains.

Correct sentence- *Major glaciers are melting, which is changing water regimes, and changing weather patterns bring incessant rains, flooding downstream areas.*

8. Answer: b

Explanation:

The correct answer is **option 2 i.e. DBCEA**.

★ Explanation

- **First is D** as it establishes the subject i.e. the Blob. **D** is the only opening segment that can lead to the formation of a meaningful and grammatically correct sentence.
- **Next is B** as it describes the 'Blob'.
- **C follows B** as it gives the duration of 'the Blob'.
- **Next is E** as it contextually follows C.
- **Last is A** as it tells where the Blob occurred.

Correct sentence- *The Blob is the name given to a heat-wave phenomenon that happened between 2013 and 2017 over 10 million sq km of waters in the Pacific.*

9. **Answer: c**

Explanation:

The correct answer is option 3), i.e., **BECAD**

★ Explanation

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While arranging the parts of the sentence given in the options, we have to find some grammatical or contextual connections between them. So, let's find out.

- **Part B** establishes the subject of the sentence. It is the perfect beginning of the sentence as it introduces what the writer is concerned with.
- **Part E** contains the verb 'appreciate' which agrees with the verb phrase 'do not'. It also provides the direct object of the sentence, i.e., the opportunities. Thus, **Part E** follows **Part B**.
- **Part C** contains the relative pronoun 'which' which refers to 'opportunities' (in **Part E**). It also contains the plural be verb 'are' that agree with the antecedent (opportunities) of 'which'. Thus, **Part C** follows **Part E**.

- **Part A** continues with the same thought and talks about 'opportunities'. It also contains the plural be verb 'were' for 'opportunities'. Thus, **Part A** follows **Part C**.
- **Part D** contains the verb 'available' for the verb phrase 'were not'. It also has the indirect object 'their parents'. Thus, **Part D** follows **Part A**.

Thus, the correct order is **BECAD**.

Correct sentence: *Children nowadays do not appreciate the opportunities which are open to them and which were not available to their parents.*

10. Answer: b

Explanation:

The correct answer is '**BEAC**'.

★ Key Points

After going through the sentence we can find that:

- **Part D** talks about spoils system which is not relevant to the context.
- So, the odd part is **D**.
- The sentence should begin with **B** followed by **E** as the conjunction '**and**' is used here to join another clause which also defines public administration.
- The next part should be **A** as it informs us why is public administration an academic discipline.
- The last part is **C** which concludes the sentence by mentioning the role of public administration.
- Only, **BEAC** is able to make a coherent sentence.

So, the correct answer is **BEAC**.

Thus the correct sentence will be : *Public administration is the implementation of government policy and also an academic discipline that studies this implementation and prepares civil employees for working in the public service .*

★ Additional Information

Implementation : carrying out or application

Discipline : field of study

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
