Reflexive Pronoun

A reflexive pronoun is a pronoun that is used when the subject and the object of a sentence are the same person or thing.

She killed herself.

 → Pl.

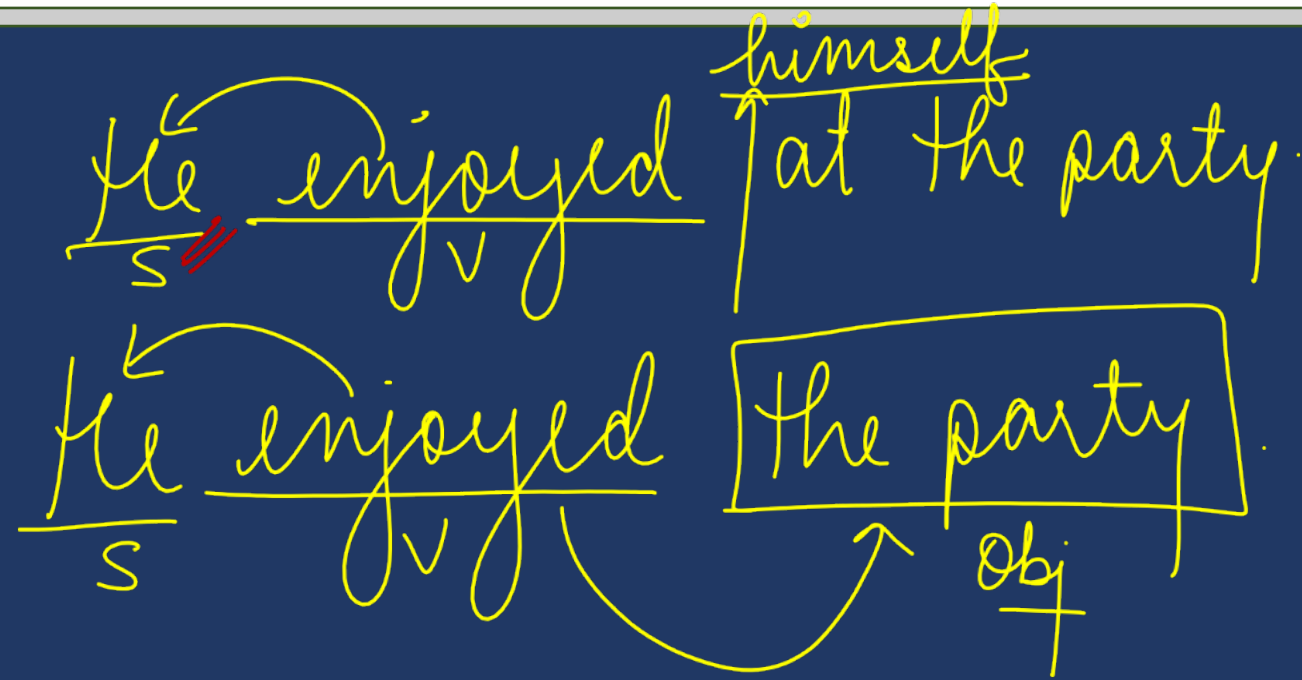
Examples of Reflexive Pronouns:

Singular: Myself, Yourself, Himself, Herself, Itself

Plural: Ourselves, Yourselves, Themselves

Usage of Reflexive Pronouns

When the subject and object are the same

Example: *She hurt herself while cooking.*

(*She is both the subject and the object.*)

For emphasis (also called intensive pronouns)

Example: *I will do it myself!*

(*Used to emphasize "I"*)

With certain verbs (common in English expressions)

Example: *Behave yourself in class.*

Example: *He enjoyed himself at the party.*

To show an action was done alone

Example: *She fixed the car herself.*

(*She did it without help.*)

She hurt (?)

Common Mistakes with Reflexive Pronouns

✗ Incorrect: ~~Myself~~ went to the store.

✓ Correct: I went to the store myself.

✗ Incorrect: Give it to myself.

✓ Correct: Give it to me.

Indefinite Pronouns

Indefinite pronouns refer to **people, places, or things** without specifying exactly who or what they are.

Examples include **someone, anyone, everyone, nothing, something, each, few**, etc.

+ V(S)

1. Indefinite Pronouns and Verb Agreement

• Singular indefinite pronouns take singular verbs.

✓ Everyone ~~is~~ invited to the party.

✓ Each of the students ~~has~~ a book.

• Plural indefinite pronouns take plural verbs.

✓ ^{Pl.} Few ~~have~~ arrived yet.

✓ ^{Pl.} Many ~~were~~ missing from class.

• Some indefinite pronouns can be singular or plural depending on the noun they refer to.

✓ Some of the water ~~is~~ cold. (Water = uncountable)

✓ Some of the apples ~~are~~ rotten. (Apples = countable)

+ V(S) ^{Many Students} Many were playing.

2. Indefinite Pronouns and Possessive Pronouns

• Use **his/her/its** with singular indefinite pronouns.

✓ Everyone ^{→ Subject} should bring **his** or ~~her~~ ID.

✓ Each of the boys brought **his** book.

✓ Many brought **their** coats.

Somebody has lost

3. Indefinite Pronouns and Negative Sentences

Words like **nobody**, **no one**, **nothing** are already negative, so don't add "not."

✗ Nobody ~~doesn't~~ like pizza.

✓ Nobody likes pizza.

✓ I don't know **anyone** here.

1. "One" as a Pronoun

"One" is used when talking about **people in general**, including the speaker but not personally referring to them.

- ✓ One should always respect others.
- ✓ If one wants to succeed, one must work hard.
- ✗ If one wants to succeed, he must work hard.

"One's" as a Possessive Pronoun

• The possessive form of "one" is "one's" (not "ones").

✓ One should do ~~his~~ (one's) duty properly.

✓ It is important to take care of ~~one's~~ health.

• Do **not** use "his" or "her" instead of "one's" when referring to "one." ✘

✘ One should always keep ~~his~~ word. (Incorrect)

✓ One should always keep one's word. (Correct)

"Oneself" as a Reflexive Pronoun

• "Oneself" is used when referring back to "one."

✓ *One should always believe in oneself.*

✓ *If one works hard, one can make oneself successful.*

• Do not use "himself" or "herself" with "one."

✗ *One should take care of himself.* (Incorrect)

✓ *One should take care of oneself.* (Correct)

4. Difference Between "One's" and "Ones"

• "One's" = Possessive form of "one" (used for general statements).

•

✓ *One should do one's best in every situation.*

• "Ones" = Plural form of "one" (used when referring to multiple items).

✓ *The blue shirts are nice, but I prefer the red ones.*

Reciprocal Pronouns

They indicate a **mutual relationship** or **shared action** between subjects.

There are only two reciprocal pronouns:

- 1. Each other** (used for two people or things)
- 2. One another** (used for more than two people or things)

1. "Each Other" (for Two People)

•Used when the action happens **between two people or things.**

✓ *The two friends hugged each other warmly.*

✓ *My parents love each other very much.*

2. "One Another" (for More than Two People)

•Used when the action happens **among more than two people or things.**

✓ *The students in the class help one another with homework.*

✓ *The team members congratulated one another after winning the match.*

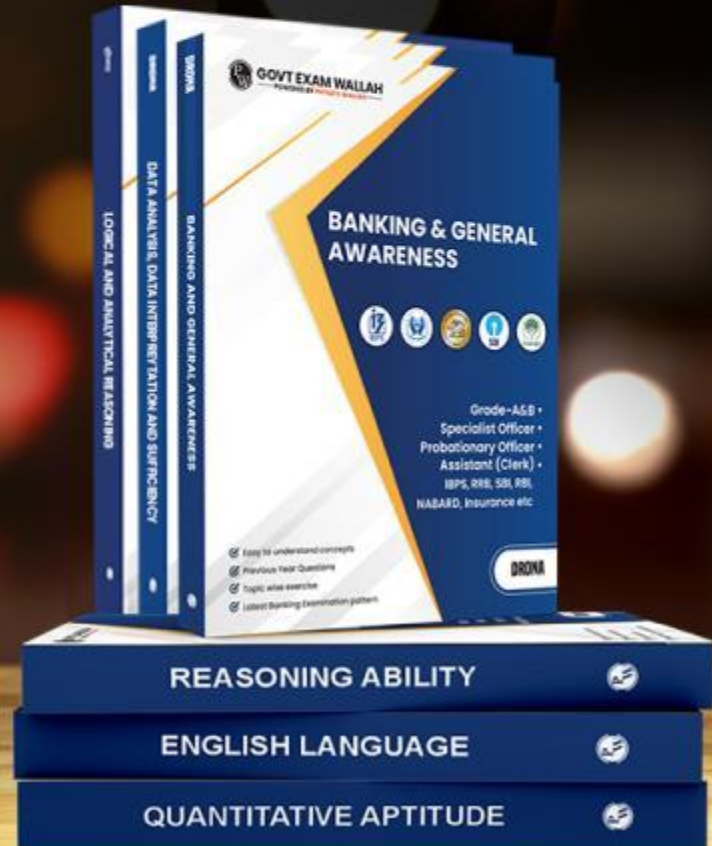
