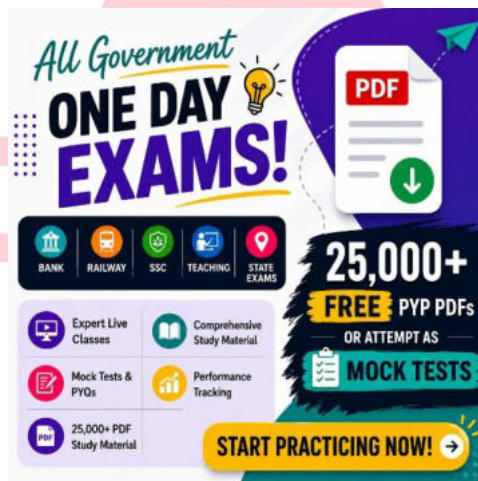

Q1. How many teams have won consecutive IPL titles as of IPL 2026?

- (a) 2
- (b) 3
- (c) 4

Sol. The correct answer is (B) 3

Explanation:

- As of the conclusion of IPL 2026, exactly 3 franchises have achieved the prestigious milestone of winning consecutive, back-to-back Indian Premier League tournament titles.
- Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) became the third franchise to enter this elite tier by winning the IPL 2026 final against Gujarat Titans at the Narendra Modi Stadium, successfully defending the title they captured in 2025.
- The first team to accomplish back-to-back titles was the Chennai Super Kings (CSK), who won consecutive championships in the years 2010 and 2011.
- The Mumbai Indians (MI) became the second franchise to achieve this legendary feat by winning consecutive trophies in the 2019 and 2020 editions of the league.

Information Booster:

- Winning consecutive championships is considered one of the hardest challenges in global franchise T20 cricket due to squad shifts, competitive dynamic leveling, and auction structures.
- RCB's historic 2026 defense was anchored by an emotional chasing masterclass from Virat Kohli, who scored an unbeaten 75 runs in the final to chase down a 156-run target against Gujarat Titans.
- The achievement established RCB as a modern powerhouse, breaking decades of championship droughts with consecutive trophies in 2025 and 2026 under captain Rajat Patidar.

- 2 Teams (Option A): This was the historical metric standing prior to May 2026, when only Chennai Super Kings and Mumbai Indians held the record for consecutive title defenses.

Q2. Which bowler won the Purple Cap in both IPL 2020 and IPL 2026?

Sol. The correct answer is (C) Kagiso Rabada

Explanation:

- South African fast bowler Kagiso Rabada achieved the rare distinction of winning the Purple Cap in two different editions of the Indian Premier League (IPL), specifically in IPL 2020 and IPL 2026.
- In the 2026 season of the IPL, playing for the Gujarat Titans (GT), Kagiso Rabada topped the bowling charts by picking up 29 wickets in 17 matches to secure the coveted cap.

- Previously, during the 2020 edition held in the United Arab Emirates, Rabada won his first Purple Cap while representing Delhi Capitals, finishing that season with a sensational haul of 30 wickets from 17 matches.
- His remarkable performance in IPL 2026 made him only the third Gujarat Titans bowler in five seasons to win the title, following in the footsteps of Mohammed Shami (2023) and Prasidh Krishna (2025).

Information Booster:

- The Purple Cap is awarded annually to the leading wicket-taker in the Indian Premier League tournament.
- Dwayne Bravo, Bhuvneshwar Kumar, and Harshal Patel are the only other iconic players who have managed to win the prestigious Purple Cap twice across their IPL careers.
- Bhuvneshwar Kumar remains the sole bowler in the history of the league to successfully defend his title in consecutive years, winning it back-to-back in 2016 and 2017 for Sunrisers Hyderabad.
- The record for the most wickets taken in a single IPL edition is jointly held by Dwayne Bravo (32 wickets in 2013 for CSK) and Harshal Patel (32 wickets in 2021 for RCB).

- Harshal Patel (Option A): Won the Purple Cap twice, first in 2021 with Royal Challengers Bengaluru and later in 2024 with Punjab Kings.

- Sudharsan struck an impressive total of 75 boundaries (fours) over the course of the tournament, anchor-building multiple massive innings for his franchise and helping them progress all the way to the final match.
- Known for his classical timing, elegant cover drives, and superb placement, the left-hander relied on finding gaps rather than just brute force, showcasing exceptional consistency across elite venues.

Information Booster:

- Sai Sudharsan has built a phenomenal reputation for consistency in the IPL, having previously claimed the Orange Cap during the 2025 season by amassing 759 runs in 15 matches at an elite average.
- During the 2026 qualifiers, Sudharsan also entered the trivia books for an unusual anomaly: he became the first batsman in IPL history to be dismissed via 'hit-wicket' on two distinct occasions in a single playoff cycle.

- Vaibhav Sooryavanshi (Option A): While the 15-year-old phenom completely dominated the overall tournament runs and six-hitting metrics (smashing 72 sixes), his boundary configuration relied vastly more on maximums than grounded fours.
- Virat Kohli (Option C): The legendary Royal Challengers Bengaluru maestro produced a match-winning, unbeaten 75 in the final to claim his second consecutive title, though his aggregate boundary count settled just under Sudharsan's mark.

- The award is determined based on points allocated by the match umpires and referees to teams after each game, evaluating their on-field discipline, respect for the opposition, adherence to the spirit of the game, and respect for the decisions of match officials.
- Punjab Kings stood out during the 19th edition of the tournament by constantly exhibiting top-tier sportsmanship and maintaining a clean track record, despite facing an intense competitive cycle on the field.
- This accolade highlights the franchise's dedication to maintaining ethical competitive values alongside their pursuit of cricket excellence throughout the 74-match league tournament.

Information Booster:

- The Fair Play Award is a team accolade presented at the conclusion of every Indian Premier League season to the franchise that best upholds the spirit of cricket.
- Umpires score each team out of 10 points per match, where 4 points are given for how the team adheres to the spirit of the game, and 2 points each are awarded for respect towards the opposition, respect towards the umpires, and respect towards the laws of cricket.
- Chennai Super Kings (CSK) historically holds the record for winning the Fair Play Award the most times in the history of the Indian Premier League.

- Royal Challengers Bengaluru (Option A): Retained their title as the IPL 2026 champions under the leadership of Rajat Patidar, outclassing Gujarat Titans in the final match, but missed out on the premier sportsmanship award.

- His exceptional ability to restrict runs in the powerplay and death overs provided great tactical leverage to his franchise.

- Bowling dot balls is considered one of the key metrics in T20 cricket because it builds immense structural pressure on the batting side, frequently inducing forced mistakes and wicket opportunities.
- Mohammed Siraj became the first bowler in IPL history to bowl two maiden overs in a single match. He achieved this milestone for Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) against Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) during the 2020 season in Abu Dhabi, finishing with incredible figures of 3/8 in his 4 overs

- Modern batting philosophies, highly aggressive powerplay approaches, flat pitches, and tactical innovations like the impact player rule combined to create an environment where bowlers faced immense pressure.
- The statistical aggregation of the season shows stunning figures, including a record-breaking grand total of 27,450 runs scored across the campaign and a massive 65 team totals crossing the 200-run milestone.

- This hyper-aggressive evolution is clearly highlighted by the fact that teams pulled off 17 successful run chases of 200+ targets during the 2026 edition alone, a feat that used to be a rare anomaly in previous decade cycles.
