- The center plays a vital role in executing specialized operations like Operation Trishul and Operation Chakra against global crime syndicates.
- Establishing a dedicated operations center modernizes India's capacity to handle international crime, financial fraud, and cyber-enabled financial offences.

- The CBI was established in 1963 by a resolution of the Ministry of Home Affairs and derives its police powers from the Delhi Special Police Establishment (DSPE) Act, 1946.

- BHARATPOL significantly modernizes India's policing infrastructure, enhancing law enforcement capabilities against cybercrime, financial fraud, and human trafficking.

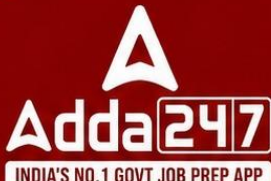
